### **CHAPTER 3**

#### **CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE**

WHEREAS, the Political Reform Act of 1974, Government Code Section 81000, et. seq., requires every local government agency to adopt and promulgate a Conflict of Interest Code; and

WHEREAS, the Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation, 2 Cal. Admin. Code Section 18730 (b), which contains the terms of a standard model Conflict of Interest Code, which can be incorporated by reference, and which will be amended to conform to the amendments in the Political Reform Act after public notice and hearings conducted by the Fair Political Practices Commission pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act, Government Code Sections 11370, et. seq.; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Rancho Murieta Community Services District has determined that the attached Exhibits accurately set forth those positions which should be designated and the categories of financial interests which should be made reportable;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Directors of the Rancho Murieta Community Services District does resolve as follows:

SECTION 1. The terms of 2 Cal. Admin. Code Section 18730 (b) and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission along with the attached Exhibits in which officials and employees are designated and disclosure categories are set forth, are hereby incorporated by reference and shall constitute the Conflict of Interest Code of the Rancho Murieta Community Services District.

SECTION 2. Pursuant to Section 4 (c) of the Code (2 Cal. Admin. Code Section 18730), all designated officers and employees shall file their statements with the Secretary of the Rancho Murieta Community Services District who shall retain a copy and forward the original to the County Clerk who is the designated filing officer.

SECTION 3. This Conflict of Interest Code shall become effective upon the date of approval by the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors, the Code - reviewing body.
