FIREWORKS SAFETY TIPS

Every year, Independence Day celebrations across the country include the fiery, colorful displays and explosive pops of consumer-grade fireworks. Consumer fireworks are as common as cookouts during America's birthday. Unfortunately, their use still results in numerous fires and bodily injuries every year. Follow these safety tips when using fireworks.

- Never allow young children to play with or ignite fireworks.
- Avoid buying fireworks that are packaged in brown paper because this is often a sign that the fireworks were made for professional displays and they may pose a danger to consumers.
- Always have an adult supervise fireworks activities. Young children suffer injuries from sparklers, which burn at temperatures of about 2,000 degrees. That is hot enough to melt some metals.
- Never place any part of your body directly over a fireworks device when lighting the fuse.
- Never try to re-light or pick up fireworks that have not ignited fully.
- Never point or throw fireworks at another person or animal.
- Alcohol and fireworks do not mix. Save your alcohol for after the show.
- Light fireworks one at a time, then move back quickly.
- After fireworks have finished burning, douse the fireworks with plenty of water with a bucket or hose before throwing them in the trash.

DON'T FORGET THE SAFETY OF PETS!

- If fireworks are being used near your home, put your pet in a safe, interior room to avoid exposure to the sound.
- Make sure your pet has an identification tag, in case your pet runs off during a fireworks display.
- Never shoot fireworks of any kind (consumer fireworks, sparklers, fountains, etc.) near pets.

USE THE FASTPASS SYSTEM FOR YOUR GUESTS THIS JULY 4TH

We have had huge success with the electronic FastPass program at the North Gate. Thank you to the residents that used this new system.

We want to remind everyone that the FastPass system is a full-time system and is able to be used all year. Please use it. The check-in process for your guests is a couple of seconds versus 30-45 seconds the regular way. We encourage all residents to use this new system all the time for their guests, and especially during major holidays when Rancho Murieta experiences more gate traffic than normal.

A reminder though, this system is only at the North Gate for Northside residents. It is not available on the South at this time. Please sign up for an account on <u>www.gateaccess.net</u>, either the desktop or mobile version. From there you will be able to send your guests the FastPass.

CHECKED YOUR HOSES LATELY?

It's a good idea to invest a few minutes in maintaining your personal water system—your water heater and the pipes that deliver water to your appliances—by taking these easy steps annually.



Flexible hoses connect your sink, toilet, washing machine and dishwasher to household water pipes. Many of these hoses are made of rubber or have rubber components, and over time all rubber plumbing components will deteriorate. Check them to make sure the material is in good shape.

Also, always check the hose connections for leaks and use Teflon tape to create a tight seal. Many leaks occur without warning, but one sign to watch for is greasy-textured black flakes when you run the hot water. That is an indicator of a deteriorating rubber hose. When you replace flexible hoses, opt for flex tubing or high quality rubber tubing labeled "chlorine resistant" for the longest life.

JUNE 2023 COMMITTEE MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

All Committee Meeting in June were canceled.

NEW FISCAL YEAR

The Board adopted the 2023-2024 Budget on June 21st, after conducting the annual Budget Hearing at the June 7th Board of Directors Meeting. The proposed service charge increases, and Special Tax adjustments were adopted at the June 21, 2023 Board of Directors Meeting and are effective with the July 1, 2023 billing statement. For the majority of area residents, the proposed budget results in an aggregate 11.17% increase (approximately \$23.85 per month) to the average residential bill for all services: water, sewer, drainage, security and solid waste.

The District remains committed to providing superior community services efficiently and professionally at a reasonable cost. The District is working diligently to identify cost savings where possible to reduce the rate increase impact on all residential and non-residential customers.

UTILITY NEWS

Water Meter Access

It is important for the District to have access to all meters for data collection and maintenance. Clear access to the box helps to ensure that it can be quickly turned off in an emergency. It is the property owner/tenant's responsibility to maintain clear access around the meter box. If the meter is obstructed or inaccessible, the District will notify the property owner/tenant to either remove the obstruction or clear the area surrounding the meter. The picture to the right is an example of an accessible meter.

Ways You Can Help With Meter Accessibility Trees, bushes and plantings

Trim bushes, trees, and grass surrounding the meter. During the growing season, plants can cover a meter box very quickly.

Pets

Keep pets away from the path that leads to the meter. If you have a guard dog for security, please let the District know so that meter readers are aware.

Objects that cover or block meters

Please make sure that no objects cover or block access to the meter box. Items that have been found blocking meters include cars, trailers, construction materials, fences, landscape bark, gravel, and plants.

Locked gates

If the meter is located behind a gate that is normally kept locked, the District will contact you to arrange access to the meter.

WATER LEAKS

The Utility Crews are fixing leaks as quickly as they can. Please call 916-354-3700 if you notice a water leak so that we can assess the leak. Water leaks between the meter and the home are the homeowners responsibility. If the leak is between the meter and the road, or if your not sure, please call the District.

SECURITY REMINDERS

Rancho Murieta Association Rule Violations. Speeding and stop sign violations by you and/or your guests are subject to Rancho Murieta Association (RMA) fines. The speed limit for golf carts is 10 miles per hour and other vehicles 25 miles per hour. Overloaded golf carts or unsafe usage, such as towing skate-boarders or bikers, are also subject to RMA fines. Golf Carts may only be operated by licensed drivers.

Worker Access Through the Gates. Workers are *ONLY* allowed access through the gates Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Saturdays 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. *No workers are permitted Sunday, and Holidays.*
