

California Waste Recovery Systems is pleased to announce some important enhancements to the programs we provide for you in Rancho Murieta. Beginning on July 1, 2013;

- 1. Household Battery Collection in your Recycling Cart:
 Residents may recycle Household Batteries by placing them in a clear,
 zipper-locked bag and putting the bag into their Recycling Cart.
 Acceptable batteries include; alkaline batteries (i.e. AAA, AA, C, D,
 button, 6-volt, 9-volt batteries) and rechargeable batteries (Nickel
 Cadmium (Ni-Cd), Nickel Metal Hydride (Ni-MH), Lithium Ion (LiIon), Nickel Zinc (Ni-Zn) and small sealed lead batteries (SSLA/Pb))
 typically found in cordless phones, power tools and laptops.
- 2. Cell Phone Collection in the Recycling Cart: Residents may also recycle Cellular Phones by placing them in a clear, zipper-locked bag and putting the bag into their Recycling Cart. Acceptable items include; any cellular phone, smart-phone, i-Pad, i-Pod or other MP3 player, PDA, as well as their batteries and charging cords.
- 3. Electronic Waste (E-Waste) collection added to our Large Item Collection Service: Electronic products (i.e. computers, VCRs, stereos, copiers, fax machines) at the end of their useful life are now acceptable for setout with our Large Item Collection Service.

- 4. Used Cooking Oil collection at the Curb: In a program similar to our Used Motor Oil collection, any cooking oil produced for food preparation and consumption purposes that is no longer useful because of use, extended storage, or spillage can be set out for collection. Just call California Waste at 354-4154 and they will deliver empty containers for your used cooking oil. Then Set out the full containers on your next regular collection day. Used Cooking Oil shall not contain water, soapsuds, and/or food debris.
- Item Collection Service: Products at the end of their useful life such as; mercury-containing thermostats, lamps (i.e. fluorescent, high intensity discharge, neon, mercury vapor, high pressure sodium, and metal halide lamps), cathode ray tube (CRT) devices (i.e. televisions, computer monitors) are now acceptable for setout with our Large Item Collection Service.
- 6. In addition to the above new items, the allowable volume of Large Item Collection Service has been increased from the current five (5) cubic yards of collection to six (6) cubic yards of collection.
