

What's New on the Local Solid Waste Front?

- AB1826- Commercial Organic Waste (Food/Green).
- AB32- Organics in the Landfill Ban.

Large Generators began April 2016; step downs in generator sizes in following years.

Local Impact: In 2023, Residential Food Waste Collection Programs must be in place. This will increase tip fees causing rise in residential rates.

AB1594- Greenwaste as Alternative Daily Cover.
Current practice ends on January 1, 2020.
Local Impact: New programs and facilities will increase tip fees causing rise in residential rates.
